We are currently updating our religious instruction records. A form has been sent home with each student for completion and return to the school office at your earliest convenience.

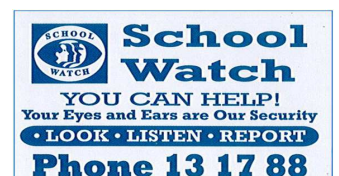
Silver Savers for Chappies
