
Yellow Edge Line

Dear School Principals

Pertussis (whooping cough) - reducing the risk for your school community

Since the beginning of 2024 there have been nearly 1400 confirmed cases of pertussis across Queensland which is higher than the past 4 years. The increase in cases is now starting in Wide Bay. This letter provides information on pertussis and actions to reduce the risk.

What is Pertussis?

Pertussis is a highly contagious respiratory infection that can cause life-threatening infection in babies and young children. Pertussis often starts with a runny nose, sneezing and tiredness. The person may then develop persistent bouts of coughing, often followed by gagging or vomiting. People with pertussis are infectious from the time of first symptoms until about 3 weeks after the onset of cough. Pertussis is spread from person to person through droplets and direct contact with respiratory secretions, especially in households, childcare and early education settings.

Vaccination against pertussis provides good protection but immunity fades which means that boosters are needed.

Actions that may reduce the risk of pertussis spreading within the school community:

- Encourage staff, volunteers and families to watch out for symptoms and see their doctor if they get a new cough. If the doctor thinks they have whooping cough, a swab from the back of the nose or throat can confirm the diagnosis.
- Encourage families to ensure all children in each household are up to date with vaccination, including vaccines due during school years.
- Remind staff and families that free pertussis vaccine is provided through GPs and hospital antenatal clinics for pregnant women during each pregnancy. This provides protection for the mother and the newborn.
- Other adults who want to reduce their likelihood of becoming ill with pertussis may consider receiving a pertussis vaccine, which can be given every 10 years.
- Promote effective hand hygiene and cough etiquette.
- Promote children and staff who are unwell to stay home.

Please note also that all Queensland residents over the age of 6 months can now access the 2024 influenza vaccine for free, through GPs and pharmacies.
